Materials List for **Drawing Botanicals in Colored Pencil** with Susan Rubin

You can use any brand of colored pencils. Do be aware that very inexpensive pencils can be difficult to layer and mix. These two brands are excellent and readily available individually in open stock.

Colored Pencils: See above. These 12 colors, in whatever brand you choose, will make all of the colors you need. If you have more pencils, bring them! The more the merrier.
