

Materials list for Purely Abstract Painting in Acrylics with Janet Bothne

Acrylic Paints: - if you can afford more colors, great, but if not try to at least get these basics. If you plan to work on large canvases, get large tubes or bottles. Try to have at least a few "heavy body" paints.

Naphthol or Cadmium Red Medium or Pyrrole Red

Cadmium Red Deep

Cadmium Yellow Deep

Yellow Ochre or Yellow Oxide

Hansa or Cadmium Yellow Light

Phthalo Blue

Phthalo Green

Burnt Umber Dark

Titanium White

Any Black

Paynes Grey

Optional: Yellow-Green, Magenta, Any Purple, Any Orange, Zinc White, Medium Grey or..your favorites!

Brushes / Palette Knives:

Bring an assortment of small & large brushes as well as at least a couple of palette knives - one small, one large (inexpensive plastic ones are fine, kitchen spatulas from the Dollar Store

work as well.) Synthetic brushes are fine, -you can even buy cheap house painting ones at Big Lots.

Palette:

A pad of palette paper or even large plastic disposable plates will do. (The pads of palette paper are often on sale, or you can use a coupon at Michaels.)

Other:

A few absorbent rags, or a towel you can rip into rags. A small spray bottle and a few stretched

canvases (rather than canvas panels). Bring all of your canvases to the first class as we will be working on a few at a time. Don't plan to work on mini, or very small canvases,

try to get at least 20" x 20" or larger for the purposes of this class.

Acrylic matte medium

One plastic tub or container for brush cleaning.

And, It's a good idea to wear your painting clothes or bring an apron.
